- 1. The Society will only register or enter the offspring of stallions which hold a current License issued by the Dales Pony Society of America (DPSA) or a License issued by DPS (UK) if the stallion is imported.
- 2. A Stallion License may be issued as soon as the stallion is 3 years old. The age is determined from the first day of the third January after birth.
- 3. A fee of \$30.00 must be included with the application form_to cover the cost of office administration. This fee is not refundable if the License is refused. Go to Forms page to print Application for Stallion License.
- 4. Before a Stallion License may be issued, a Veterinarian, nominated by the stallion owner, shall examine the stallion to ensure that it is free from disease and free from hereditary defects. The Vet shall submit a report to the DPSA, see Forms page to print Vet Report.
- 5. The Veterinary Fee is the responsibility of and shall be paid by the stallion owner.
- 6. Stallion owners are advised that a Vet will not attempt to examine an unmanageable stallion; Stallions should be halter trained and be used to being handled.
- A Stallion License may be refused or revoked if the stallion is found on examination to have an infectious or inheritable disease.
 Inheritable conditions which will disqualify a stallion are:
 - a. Cataract, Aniridia (absence if the iris) or any other eye malformation.
 - b. Laryngeal paralysis (roaring or whistling)
 - c. Malocclusion of the teeth (Parrot mouth)
 - d. Sub-luxation of the patella
 - e. Stringhalt, Shivering, Wobbler Disease.
 - f. Umbilical or inguinal hernia
 - g. Multiple exostoses, Ringbone, Sidebone, Bone Spavin, Navicular Disease
 - **h.** Defective genital organs

All Dales ponies are required to be DNA'd when first registered with DPSA.

All Dales ponies are required to be microchiped when first registered with DPSA.

All stallions seeking to be licensed must have their DNA on file with DPSA.

All stallions seeking to be licensed must have their microchip number on file(DPSA).
